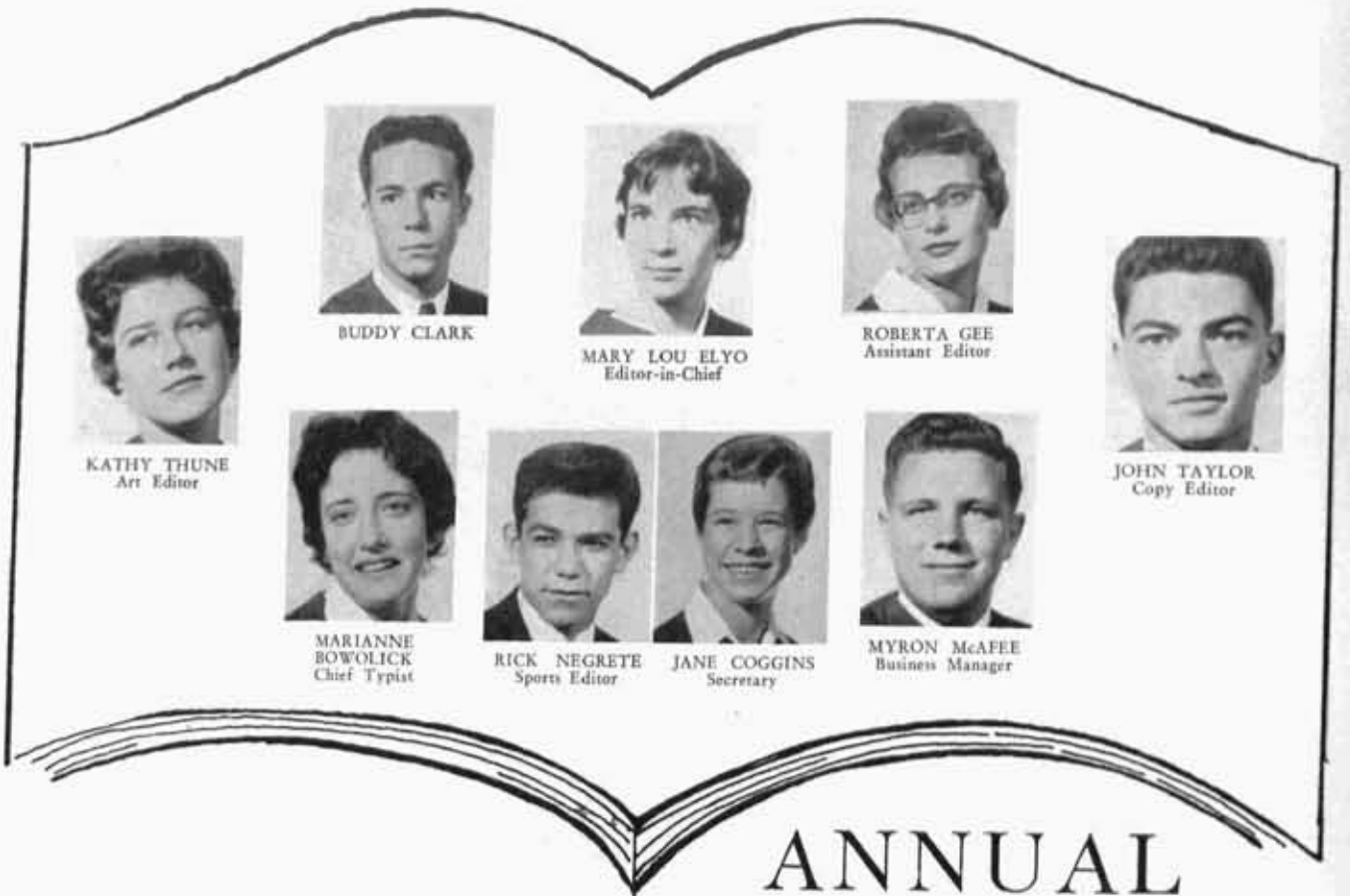
# NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Thursday, 12 November: The Boy Scouts and Explorers of the Orleans Area Command are scheduled to sell Christmas trees this year.



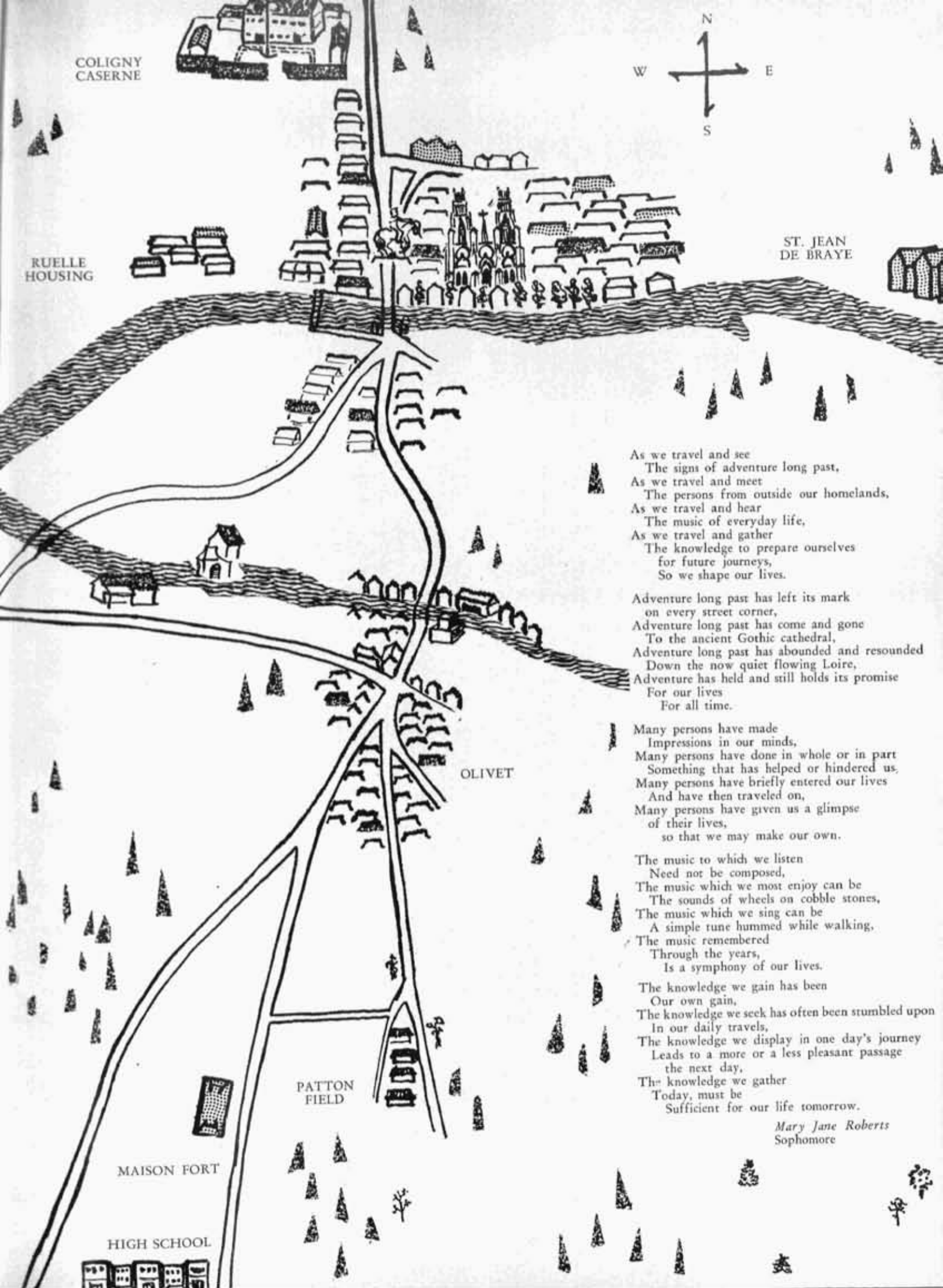
Friday, 11 December: Flu shots will be given on Monday.
